The School of Applied Psychology, Counseling and Family Therapy at Antioch University Seattle invites applications for two full-time core faculty candidates for our doctoral psychology (PsyD) program in Clinical Psychology. Our program, founded in 2004, currently has 8 core faculty and seeks to expand to 10 full-time core faculty members. The mission of our Psy.D. program is to educate students to become informed, effective practitioners and change agents in a diverse world. Core faculty members participate fully in the academic and governance functions of the program, the school, and the university. Key responsibilities include carrying the equivalent of 24 quarter-units per year; mentoring students (including dissertation, clinical supervision, and academic advisement); participating actively in program, school, and university-wide committees and functions; maintaining a program of scholarship, professional and community service. Specific areas of specialization are open, but the ideal candidate would have specialty knowledge in research methods and data analysis (quantitative and qualitative), assessment (e.g. personality, cognitive, neuropsychological), or science-based courses (e.g., cognition and affect, social psychology). Preference will be given to candidates who have experience teaching at the graduate university level and have an active clinical practice. We desire a proven history of active participation in teaching, clinical practice, supervision, and research. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply. Ideal candidates will complement and build on existing strengths within the program. Successful candidates will bring evidence of an active research program, innovative clinical interventions, or engagement with public policy.

Founded in 1852, Antioch established itself as alternative education from its inception, and in the 1920s Antioch became synonymous with sweeping transformations in higher education. Today, Antioch University Seattle, along with the other four campuses and two campus-wide programs make up Antioch University, take pride in our progressive heritage and continues to foster ground-breaking programs in higher education. The Psy.D. program continues this tradition of alternative education while holding to the highest professional standards in clinical psychology and valuing contextual theory and diversity. Qualifications:

Applicants must have a minimum of a doctoral degree in Clinical Psychology (Psy.D. or Ph.D.) and be licensed or licensable in Washington State as a clinical psychologist with a minimum of two years post-licensure experience.
